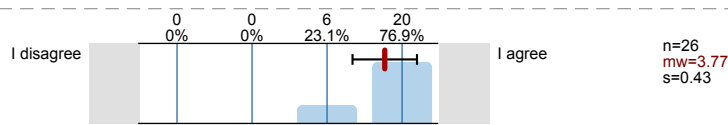
1.2) Good/bad support (see question 1.1), because...

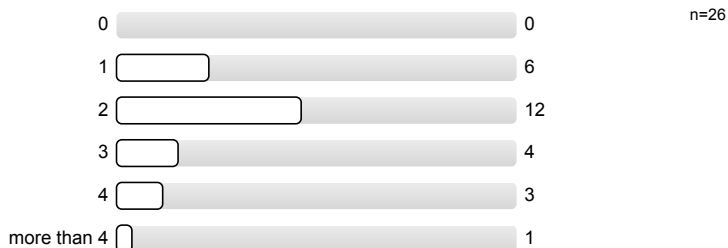
- - too much content, it would be better to focus on certain aspects and dive deep there
