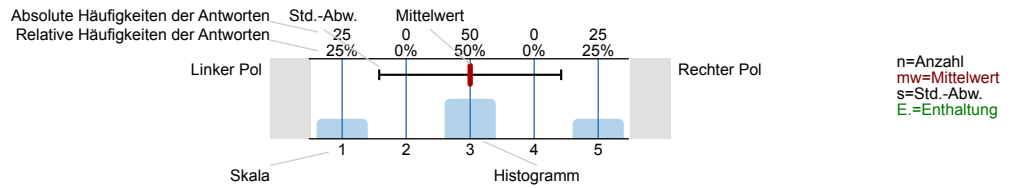




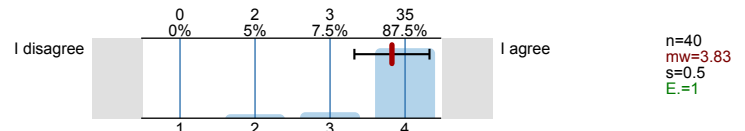

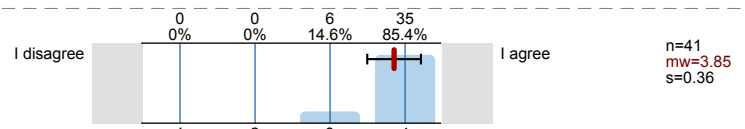
1.1) The students are supported well within the course



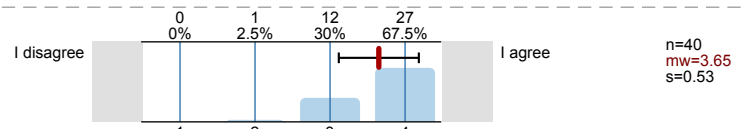
1.2) Good/bad support (see question 1.1), because...

- Whatever questions I got, I had my answers from both the professor and assistant in time.

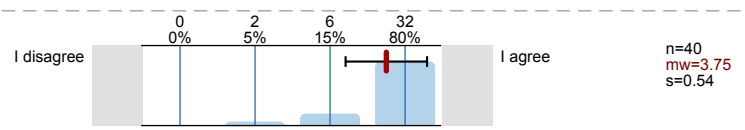

- Also it's good to get a better understanding, there is a lot to cover: tutorial, revision questions, Perspective App...

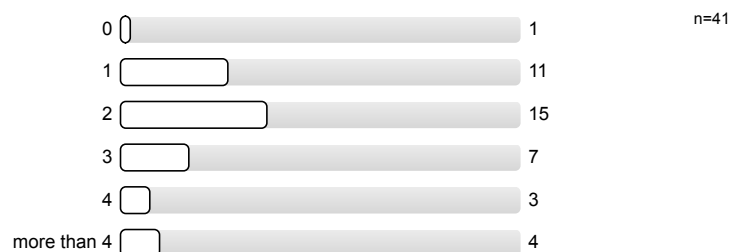
